Approach to the exploitation and human trafficking on the southern European border. The construction of a life story.

Content:

The course content would be divided into:

- Approach to human trafficking and an introduction to the southern European border
- The conditioned speech of the people linked to trafficking.
- The need for biographical narration in the identification and protection processes.
- Creative tools to accompany the narrative processes.
- Empowerment. Women linked to trafficking as protagonists of processes of social transformation.

Methods:

Masterclasses Practical activities from creative tools Viewing of audiovisual material and video forum

Competences and skills to be acquired:

- Know how to distinguish the phenomena of human trafficking, exploitation and smuggling
- Locate the southern border both geographically and geopolitically within the European Union
- Identify indicators that imply coercion when narrating the life story by people linked to trafficking
- Learn to follow the life story avoiding secondary victimization and from care.
- Recognize the agency of groups in situations of high vulnerability and oppression
